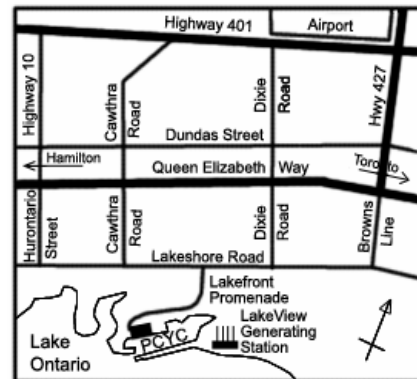
Cancellation Policy

Basic Keelboat Program

This program (28 hours) is recommended for those students with little or no experience, who wish to build a solid foundation of knowledge and skills. It teaches the student the basic operation of a small keelboat in light to moderate conditions. The course is an excellent primer for those wanting to get into sailing with practical on the water topics including:

Boat parts/terminology	Knots
Safety Equipment	Anchoring
Tacking and gybing	Emergencies
Rigging / Derigging	Points of sail
Handling under power	Navigation
Rules of the road	Casting off & Docking

Successful completion of this course qualifies you for the CYA Basic Cruising Standard and access to club owned keel boats. Sessions will run Sat/Sun 9am – 5pm for two weekends or Mon/Wed or Tues/Thurs 6-9:30 pm for four weeks.

Keelboat Trial Program

Following successful completion of the basic keel boat course students will be allowed to use club boats at reasonable rates when boats are not required for training. The program gives you the chance to try the sailing experience without the financial commitment.

Learn to Sail in Dinghies

To sail well you need to "feel" the boat. Sailing a dinghy is the only true way to develop that feel. We have 2 levels of program catering to almost anyone

White Sail Program

This 28-hour program is recommended for students with little or no experience, who wish to learn basic sailing skills. Students completing this course should be competent sailing a dinghy in light winds. The course covers the CYA's White Sail, Levels I, II and III standards. The Club provides the boats. The course is usually taught in Nutshell or Club 420 dinghies. Sessions will run Mon/Wed or Tues/Thurs 6:30 pm for four weeks.

Bronze Sail Program

This 28 hour program allows White Sail graduates to tune their boat handling skills and learn the basics of flying a spinnaker. The course covers the CYA's Bronze Sail, Levels IV, and V standards. The Club provides the boats. The course is usually taught in Club 420 dinghies. Sessions will run Mon/Wed or Tues/Thurs 6:30 pm for four weeks.

Crew Memberships

A crew membership is included with all adult sailing courses. You and your family will have full use of the Clubhouse and grounds for the duration of your course.

What Students Need

Students must bring their own government-approved lifejacket. Sunscreen, a towel and a full change of clothes are essential and must be supplied by the student.
